



Information regarding the Supervision of Master Theses by Professor Oesch

Please refer to the relevant information sheets regarding master theses that are available on the website of the Faculty of Law of the University of Zürich. Master theses may be awarded with the following amounts of ECTS:

- 6 ECTS = approx. 25 pages = approx. 62,500 characters;
- 12 ECTS = approx. 40 pages = approx. 100,000 characters;

The amount of characters includes the whole text (incl. footnotes). The thesis shall be written in Times New Roman, font size 12, single sided print for the hard copy, with 16-point line spacing, and with a margin of at least 5cm on the right side for correcting remarks. Please include the following statement of authorship at the end of your paper, indicate date and place, and sign it before handing it in:

“I, the undersigned, hereby declare that I have used no other sources and aids other than those indicated. All passages quoted from publications or paraphrased from these sources are indicated as such, i.e. cited and/or attributed. This thesis was not submitted in any form for another degree or diploma at any university or other institution of tertiary education. I agree that this thesis may be assessed digitally for plagiarism.”

The topic, working title, research question, and the outline of the thesis shall be discussed with, and approved by, Prof. Oesch and the assigned research and teaching fellow at the chair (primary contact person) before starting to write the thesis. During the writing process, the students may approach the chair with any open questions they have.

Three bound and signed hard copies of the thesis have either to be handed in in person (Prof. Matthias Oesch, Rämistrasse 74/18, 8001 Zürich) or sent by postal mail (no registered mail needed). Additionally, the thesis has to be submitted by e-mail to the chair (lst.oesch@rwi.uzh.ch) within the relevant deadline.

Depending on the deadline of the paper (and the time period left until the deadline for informing the administrative office of the grade), it is possible to revise a paper that was awarded an insufficient grade. An insufficient thesis that was revised can be graded with a grade not exceeding 4.0.
